

The Church Council took action on a number of intriguing things, including:

 Approving Nate Sah's proposed Eagle Scout project of a 'little free pantry' at Salem.

Salem will be added to the Central Oklahoman Lutheran Churches sponsoring the weekly radio show call Sing for Joy, produced by St. Olaf on Sundays 8:30am on KUCO (90.1) or streamed from their site anytime (<u>https://www.stolaf.edu/singforjoy/</u>)

 Approving an inquiry into what it would mean, and take to help sponsor an Afghan refugee family (along with other churches) should we get the opportunity.

Some of our past collections:


- * baby items and vitamins for Tanzania

BAKE-QUILT & CRAFT SALE (DATE TO BE DETERMINED)

We need pies to sell during our (possibly drive thru) sale. To start making pies for us to sell here at the church, here is the recipe. If you need pie plates or paper boxes for the pies, please check with Priscilla Gerfen or Lisa in the office.

SALEM'S FAMOUS APPLE PIE

Oil Pie Crust for 4 single pie crusts (2 double crust pies)3 1/2 c. flour1 c. Oil1 tsp. salt6 T. water

Apple Pie filling for 1 pie (double the filling amounts for 2 pies)1 c. sugar5 to 6 c. peeled, cored & sliced apples3 T. flour5 pats butter or margarine



Crusts: Mix flour and salt; stir in oil and water, forming a ball. Divide into 4 parts and roll out each between 2 pieces of waxed paper.

Filling: In large bowl, mix together sugar, flour and cinnamon. Mix in prepared apples. Place in crust-lined pie pan. Top with butter. Cover with top crust, add vent and finish edges.

Freeze, or if baking- prewarm oven at 375, put pie in for 10 minutes; reduce heat to 350 for 45 minutes longer, or until apples are done.
