Our Bake Sale is scheduled for December 4, from 9am-noon. Contributions of baked goods and crafts are needed and greatly appreciated.





We Need Bakers!!

Famous Salem Apple Pies – Kit Instructions

This kit makes one two-crust apple pie. In addition to the ingredients here, please add:

CRUST: 1 cup oil

3 Tbls water

PIE FILLING: 5 pats butter or margarine Directions:

CRUST: add water and oil to flour packet ingredients, stirring to form a ball. Divide into two parts and roll out between 2 pieces of waxed paper.



FILLING: Core and peel apples, cut into chunks (3/4 - 1)" size). Toss apples with the sugar-cinnamonflour packet ingredients. Place in crust-lined pie pan. Add 5 pats of butter/margarine atop the apples. Cover with top crust and finish edges.

Place completed pie in storage bag and freeze.

If you have freezer space to keep the pie, please do so and bring it to church before the Bake Sale. If you sell your pie(s) or decide to keep them, please collect \$10 each and turn in the payment(s). Note: please tell your recipients to bake the pie(s) at 375 for 10 minutes and then reduce heat and bake at 350 for 45 minutes (longer if pies are baked while frozen).
