Over the past 4 years, Salem has provided support for immigrant children in Stillwater Public Schools' English-as-a -second-language (ESL) program: backpacks/school supplies as well as winter hats/ mittens/scarves. This year, we will collect items to help these children improve their reading skills, in a project we're calling The Reading Buddy Collection.

Reading aloud can be a daunting (and sometimes terrifying) task for children, and research shows that it is much easier for a child to read to an animal. Salem's own Dave Lewis and his poodle Parker have participated in such programs.. The next best thing to a real dog is a stuffed animal – a reading buddy. So, Salem will provide small stuffed animals and books to these kids. Here's what we will collect: *Small, new stuffed animals –

no bigger than 12 inches, that can be cuddled by a child *New books for the children to keep and share with their families

- Books needed are "board" books (like Little Golden Books),
 Picture books,
- 3) A few "chapter" books the kind written for 12-and-under
 - (including age-appropriate "graphic" novels/comic books).

The ESL teachers host a family event for the children and families in November. At that time, children will "adopt" a stuffed animal and one or more books. Sure would be fun to be a fly-on-the-wall at this event!

Our collection table will be in the hallway outside the nursery in coming weeks, and there will be some examples of books and buddies. So, keep an eye out for books and toys to purchase. The toy and the book don't have to "match" – i.e. a book about a puppy and a stuffed dog. The books don't even have to have animal characters.

If you have questions, please ask Annette Cowell, Salem's liaison with the ESL faculty, or Priscilla Gerfen, Service Ministry Chairman. In my childhood church we children often sang a hymn that I loved:

Tell me the stories of Jesus I love to hear, Things I would ask him to tell me if he were here. Scenes by the wayside, tales of the sea, Stories of Jesus, tell them to me.

Jesus knew the power of a story – witness the number that were recalled and handed on to the gospel writers! We don't know the Aramaic word he used for them, but apparently the best Greek word for it is 'parabola', or in English, 'parable.'.

The Greeks loved smashing two words together to form one. 'Parabola' is made from 'para' – meaning 'alongside', like in 'parallel', and 'bola' – meaning 'to throw'.



So a parable is not just a story with a moral to it, it is a story to throw alongside life, one that reveals a dynamic of the Kingdom of God. An easy example would be 'throwing' the parable of the Good Samaritan alongside your life when you see someone in need. It propels you toward mercy.

Or, perhaps it brings you up short when you are making an assumption about the character of an enemy.

In the month of September our gospel readings are stories of Jesus telling stories:

Sept 3 Building a tower, waging a war,

Sept 11 Losing a sheep, losing a coin,

Sept 18 A shrewd manager putting one over on his boss

Sept 25 A wealthy man learning the hard way not to ignore a neighbor in need.

Join us for worship and let these stories roll alongside life. How will these stories nudge us, move us, call us into account, comfort us and reveal the kingdom?

Scenes by the wayside, tales of ... a sheep! Stories of Jesus, tell them to me.

Both of these ministries already have some core team planners, but for Salem to 'own' the outreach vision, we need more. You need not commit to attending, just to visioning and planning. Contact Pastor Sally for more information or to sign on.

Altar in the Garden – An outdoor worship experience (the OSU Botanical Garden) designed to be family friendly, but welcoming participants of all ages. Our hope is to reach out to people who want faith formation but are currently unchurched, but it also can simply be an alternative devotional worship for church members as well. (We are currently looking at a late September into October for a four week session). Do you especially know God's presence in the natural world? This planning group might be a place for you.

Sunday Evening – A half hour devotional service at 5:00 pm. We hope that students or young adults in the community might find this a good time to gather—but again, whomever is drawn to it would be welcome. We have two excellent musicians (acoustic guitar and flute) to accompany songs, we share scripture and a message or invite discussion, and a provide time for candlelit prayer. If you want to see our outreach to students increase, this planning group might be a place for you.
