The World Is About to Turn

In November it can feel like we barely take a breath and Christmas is upon is (or is that October...or September...). But in a church that observes the liturgical calendar it really is the 'end of the year' and 'the beginning of a new one'. And chock full of special Sundays!

<u>November 6</u>: All Saints Sunday, when we celebrate the saints, living eternally and now, -- all who have been made holy through Christ in baptism. We light candles during prayer for those church members who have been baptized or entered the church triumphant this past year, plus one candle to represent all of those saints we hold dear. We sing the great church hymn, "For All the Saints!"

November 13: The final 'green' Sunday of the church calendar, walking still with Jesus into Jerusalem in the gospel of Luke.

<u>November 20</u>: Christ the King Sunday, when we recall in scripture and song all of the seasons of the church year, from Advent to Advent, beholding the beautiful processional crosses that change with the seasons.

<u>November 27</u>: The First Sunday of Advent and of the next church year, when we begin anew the waiting time – waiting for the celebration of Jesus' birth, and waiting for his coming again.

What a feast of Sundays!

# **Advent Evening Prayer: "And Mary Said"**


November 30, December 7 & 14 at 7pm (Soup at 6)

## Salem's Famous Apple Pie

Oil Pie Crust for 2 Pies (makes 4 individual 9 incrusts)

3 1/2 c. flour 1 c. Oil 1 tsp. salt 6 T. water



## Apple Pie filling for 1 pie

1 c. sugar 3 T. flour 5 to 6 c. peeled, cored & sliced apples

1 tsp. cinnamon 5 pats butter or margarine

**Crusts:** Mix flour and salt; stir in oil and water, forming a ball. Divide into 4 parts and roll out between 2 pieces of waxed paper. Makes top and bottom crust for 2, 9-inch pies.

**Filling:** In large bowl, mix together sugar, cinnamon and flour. Toss prepared apples in dry mixture to coat. Place in curst-lined pie pan. Add 5 pats of butter. Cover with top crust and finish edges. Freeze for the Bake Sale.
