

# Thoughts on the ELCA's Youth Gathering from Council Member, Matthew Schmidt

After being canceled twice in 2021 and 2022, the ELCA's Youth Gathering will be held July 16-20th 2024 in New Orleans, LA. The Gathering has been in New Orleans three times before: 1997, 2009 and 2012. The theme is "Created to Be" based on Psalm 139:14. "I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well." The stated goals of the Gathering are to provide opportunities for faith formation through worship, interactive learning, Bible study, service and fellowship.

In 2017, I visited Guatemala and was able to do some service projects and really enjoyed the opportunity to help others, so I am looking forward to the accompaniment day while at the Gathering. I will also enjoy meeting the 1000's of other Lutheran youth from around the country and learning more about the city of New Orleans. I have never been to a Gathering and only heard stories from my two older sisters. I am excited to finally be able to experience it first hand!

The Gathering offers several programs over a five-day period and participants will rotate these areas each day. Groups will move through Interactive Learning, Accompaniment Day and Synod Day throughout the week. Each evening everyone will gather at the Superdome for worship, music and guest speakers. Each day will have its own theme. 1. "We are created to be brave, to show up with an open mind and heart, willing to be challenged. 2. We are created to be authentic, to bring our whole selves and know that we are loved by our Creator. 3. We are created to be free, to be transformed by the gospel. 4. We are created to be disruptive, to work for justice for all of our siblings. 5. We are created to be disciples, to be sent out into the world to love our neighbor just as we are loved by God. According to the Youth Gathering website, "New Orleans, has always been its true, authentic self. Our theme, "Created to Be", highlights the arts, music and soul of this beautiful, vibrant and resilient city. New Orleans was built to host and be a city where all God's children come together."

Because of previous cancellations, in addition to the Youth Gathering for 8th through 12th graders, there will be the first ever "Young Adult Gathering". It is open to everyone the ages of 18 and 35 with programming geared toward this age group.

### Report on 2023 Trip to Tanzania

In August of this year I went on a short trip to Tanzania with Nancy Bean, one of our long time team members. Because it had been 3 years since we had been there, due to Covid, we wanted touch base with all of our friends, and let them know we hadn't forgotten them.

Everyone is anxious for us to come back! It is easier to see the changes that have occurred while we were gone. Mazimbu would really like to have a general surgeon. Dr Kivuma has retired, but there are now two OB/GYNs and a pediatrician. They have a new anesthesia machine, can do generals on children. They would like a fetal monitor or a fetal doppler. Lutheran Junior Seminary has done lots of remodeling. All rooms are considered single with a double bed, a fan, and an in-room bathroom.

Roadwork has been done in Dar, some parts with 6 -8 lanes of traffic, but goes back to the 2 lane highway most of the way to Morogoro. The train would be great if it gets final approvals - most infrastructure in place. Many more petrol stations along the highway. Berega has made changes, improvements. all fencing completed, new sunflower press building & oil processing project functioning. New office/classroom building almost completed. Bridge over the river almost completed. They are being able to provide more support to the bintis after they leave Berega.

Bishop Mameo and the Diocese seem to be doing well. There is a new head of the Department of Women & Children who will help us get our paperwork completed. Ebenezer Secondary Math/Science School is completed- 200 students, 70 acre campus, dorms, staff housing, dining hall, etc. Women's Center is also completed.

We were able to finally deliver the money we had collected for sewing machines for the women's group Pr. Sally visited in 2016, at Sokonie Church. They were pleased, and surprised that we still remembered them.

I have just sent out an email to all who have expressed interest in going to Tanzania in 2024. We are looking at July 26 to August 12 or August 2 to August 19, 2024.

## Apple Pie Makers Needed November 11 & 18, from 10 am - noon


