Directions to the Cemetery for Easter Sunday:

Starting at 6th (Hwy 51) and Western, take Hwy 51 west until you see the 2nd cemetery sign, ~ 10.7 miles. (If you get to route 86 going to Perry, you've gone too far.) Vasser road goes north (right) and there is a house close by. Just after the house (.25 miles) a dirt road goes off to the right. Take this road back east .8 miles (crossing a cattle guard) until you get to the cemetery which is on the left.

Dress warmly and bring a flashlight if you have one handy.

Spring is in the air. Seems to be early this year as Easter is March 31st.

So many things are going on at Salem right now. The Buildings and Grounds Ministry is working so hard to get everything spruced up in our building and the surrounding grounds. This group consist of a great group of people and we should all give them our support on the designated clean-up day on March 16th if you are able. The Task Force for the Homeless is coming together and they have had their first meeting and are in the process of identifying their priorities and a plan of action. There has been a revival of the Mutual Ministry and they are working through the procedures and policies of the Salem organization. Worship and Music have worked hard to prepare



for Lent, Easter, and the absence of Lisa for a couple of months. Service is continuing their efforts to serve some of the needs of our neighbors. Including the offering of letters for Bread for the World on March 17th following Worship and the designation of the fifth Sunday donations for the Tanzania Mission Trip on March 31st.

Salem has received our certification from the national Reconciling in Christ organization. RIC has had this certificate framed and it is located on the wall as you enter the building from the east parking lot. The Call Committee has submitted Salem's Ministry Site Profile to the Bishop. Now we wait for the Bishop to match us with possible candidates. We will have Holy Week as usual. Pastor Joshua Johnson will lead us on Palm Sunday and Pastor Peter Olson, Assistant to the Bishop will be here of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter. The Easter Sunrise service at the cemetery will be led by Lay people. There is so much going on and the above are just the ones I have highlighted. The council would like to thank everyone who is working so hard to keep Salem moving forward. We would also like to thank Lisa for all the hard work she has put into preparing us for her absence.

Hi,

As I will be gone in March and April, I'm hoping you all can help keep the building safe and clean. If you are here in the evening, even if others are here, would you please....

1) Walk the building and check that the doors are all locked. The main doors are the northwest, Elm St. entry, the Kitchen/Parish Hall doors, the main hallway door and the doors leading to the offices.



- 2) All of the outside lights for those doors should be on. (Outside light switch is the far right one)
- 3) For the inside lights, with the exception of the north hallway light, and any one of the long tube lights in the alcove in ceiling of the Parish Hall all of the security lights are always on. They don't have on/off switches. So if you find a light that has to be switched on, please turn it off.
- 4) Please make sure that the dishwasher is run if it's over 2/3 full and that the sinks and countertops are wiped clean.

Jocelyn Aguilar , my sub, will be checking everything Monday-Thursday mornings as she leaves. A repeat evening check is essential. Thank you! Lisa

Geodes look plain on the outside but contain beautiful crystals. Create these "rocks" to show how God makes us new on the inside.

What you need:

- Clean cardboard egg carton
- Scissors (and adult help)
- Epsom salt
- Plastic zippered bags (one per color of dye)
- Food coloring
- Glue
- Paintbrush

GLUE

What you do:

- 1. Cut out the tops and bottoms of all the egg compartments so you can make 6 ball shapes.
- 2. In each bag, put 3 tablespoons of Epsom salt and a drop or two of food coloring. Seal and shake to mix.
- 3. With the paintbrush, spread glue inside two egg-carton halves. Sprinkle a spoonful of Epsom salt into those halves. Then close and shake.
- 4. Open your homemade geode and shake out excess salt.
- 5. Optional: Preserve the crystals with a coat of clear-drying glue.

Blessed are you

The Beatitudes receive little attention, lamented novelist Kurt Vonnegut. "But, often with tears in their eyes, [Christians] demand that the Ten Commandments be posted in public buildings. And, of course, that's Moses, not Jesus. I haven't heard [anyone] demand that the Sermon on the Mount, the Beatitudes, be posted anywhere."

Jesus' Beatitudes have much to teach about selflessness, mourning, peacemaking and more. Jim Berger, author of *Being Sermon on the Mount Christians*, explains that those teachings were once "viewed as a mandate for the faithful." Post-Reformation, they became less law-like and more of a "liberating directive." Berger writes, "For Jesus, being and doing are inseparable. The Sermon is at once theory and application. It is not enough to read it or hear it. Jesus intends it to be how we live."
