Here is what happened: I went to North Carolina April 20 to help care for my mother, who had suffered a couple of mild strokes. There I developed a few odd symptoms and John advised me to go to the ER for suspected gall bladder trouble. I had surgery to remove it but was later dismayed to learn that I have a rare gall bladder cancer. John came out to fetch me and the last couple of weeks have been filled with tests and procedures to determine the best course of action. I now await a schedule for chemotherapy. This is a tough cancer to deal with, but I am ready to give

it a fight. Of course my family and I will be most appreciative of your prayers, as you have prayed for us so often in the past.

June's Semi-Annual Meeting


The Annual Report has been sent out by email. A few paper copies will be available Sunday, June 4th. Please pick one up if you can't access it on-line.
