**Sunday, March 16**–9:30am Service...Breck will preach. Brunch following service in parish hall. Opportunity to hear more about Breck (from Breck) and to ask questions or make comments.

Breck will meet with the Council, Mutual Ministry and Treasurer while she is in Stillwater.

**Sunday, March 23**–9:30 Service...Pr. Peter will preside. Congregational Meeting immediately following service. Votes to call Breck and approve compensation & Benefits package.

March is going to be a very busy month for the Salem family. There are very important events happening that will need the attention of each one of us. We start off the month (March 2<sup>nd</sup>) with a visiting pastor. The Rev. Dr. Guy Erwin, President of United Lutheran Seminary in Philadelphia leading our worship/communion and our adult discussion hour.

Ash Wednesday (March 5<sup>th</sup>) begins a most hallowed time of our church year. Priscilla Gerfen will be offering her gracious words for our Mid-week Lenten Services. Proceeded by Salem's legendary soup suppers. (March 12-April 9).

The highlight of the month will be a congregational visit by pastoral candidate, Breck Cogswell (March 14-16). There will be opportunities for the congregation to interact with Breck on Saturday. We will be receiving additional information from the call committee on exact details in the next couple of weeks. Breck will be preaching at our service on the 16<sup>th</sup>. I would encourage everyone to attend this meeting if possible. Per the terms of our constitution, members must be present at the meeting to vote.

Fast forward to April. **SAVE THE DATE:** April 26, 2025. There will be a church-wide retreat on that date at St. Francis of the Woods. Rev. Peter Olson will be our leader. We would urge everyone to attend if possible. Fun, discussion, and planning. More details to follow. Hope to see everyone on April 26<sup>th</sup>.

# Ending Hunger – Offering of Letters

While it sounds like everything in Washington is in chaos, our advocates at Bread for the World assure us that legislation continues to be drafted, committees meet, and congressional members are aware of input from constituents. Our Offerings of Letters in support of ending hunger are more important than ever amid the current distractions. They provide our Senators and Representatives with the support needed to continue forging bipartisan alliances on tax credits that move families above the poverty line, as well as programs to alleviate campus hunger and address the nutritional needs of mothers and their babies.

Salem's 2025 Offering of Letters will be held in between service and Sunday school on Sunday, April 6th. Information will be shared about how Bread for the World advocacy and the Offering of Letters are used by members of Congress to forge alliances and engage cosponsors for legislation. We will share what we know about congressional efforts to end hunger in America. We will provide you an opportunity to support your representatives. We will discuss ways to increase email effectiveness.

Spring is just around the corner and Salem's grounds and building need some helping hands to prepare our church home for the Easter season.

The first opportunity is Saturday March 8 from 9 am to noon. Many hands are needed to prepare our butterfly garden for butterflies who will arrive in April. The dead stalks from last years plants must be carefully removed and taken to the recycling center. Then the entire garden will then be gently covered in mulch.
