

Naserian Kambaine is a beloved member of our Salem community and a graduate student from Arusha, Tanzania, working in Stillwater to complete her Ph.D in Chemical Engineering. She is the eldest of 6 children and her father is a Lutheran minister. He and Naserian's stepmother believe both their daughters and sons should have equal educational opportunities; however, it is a struggle to provide the necessary funds.

Traditionally, in Tanzania, girls leave school at an early age to help with chores, childcare and farming, then marry and start families. Naserian's family is committed to changing that for their children.

When I met Naserian at Salem and heard the story of her family, I hoped perhaps we could help her family by paying school fees for her two youngest siblings. Other siblings are in secondary school with scholarships or have graduated from college.

Thanks to your generous support, we have paid the school fees for Nathan and Neng'ida for the past two years, enabling them to continue their education. And we have the funds needed to support both children for the upcoming 2026 school year. Your commitment ensured that vital educational needs were met, directly funding tuition, supplies, and other necessities. Because of you, Nathan and Neng'ida have the opportunity to pursue their dreams and build a better future for themselves and their community.
